Conditions of entry



1. A completed Entry Form acknowledges understanding and acceptance of all Conditions of Entry to this event.
2. This event will be conducted in accordance with the current EA Dressage Rules and FEI Dressage rules where the former do not apply.
3. Please ensure you are familiar with the Equestrian WA Codes of Conduct. Please refer to the EWA website for more information www.equestrianwa.org.au.
4. Closing Date for Entries: Entries must be received by close of business, 7 days prior to the event.
No entries after this time will be accepted. Emailed entries on the Official Entry Form are acceptable with payment by Direct Deposit.
Entry forms must be correctly completed and full payment must be received by the closing date. Any mistakes or incomplete information will result in the entry not being accepted and returned for correction.

6. Entry Fees: Training test \$20 per test
7. Draw: The draw will be available on the Swan Valley Equestrian Park website 2 days prior to the event. Amendments to the draw may be made no later than 24 hours before the start of the event. Event Organizers will attempt to contact competitors if a change affects them but final responsibility is on the competitor to check the draw on the day of competition. Whilst every attempt will be made to adhere to the start times in the draw, it is the rider's responsibility to be aware via the Marshall if an arena is running ahead of schedule. If this does occur you may be asked to ride earlier than the draw time.
8. It is recommended that competitors report to the Marshall for inspection 20 minutes prior to competing.
9. The Event Organizers retain the right to alter or amend the program and competitions offered. Entries will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Entrants who do not adhere to the EWA Code of Conduct will find entries will not be accepted.
10. Catering: Food and refreshments will be available.
11. Yards: A limited number of day yards are available on a first come basis.
Horses are permitted to be tied to floats, providing it is safe to do so and the float is attached to a vehicle where the handbrake is on. Please ensure horses are provided adequate room, shade and water.
The erection of float yards is not permitted in the parking area beside the arena.
12. Refunds and Scratchings: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical

or veterinary certificate is produced within 5 days of the completion of the event. In such cases 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the event organizer. Entry fees will be refunded in full for withdrawals before the closing date, and, for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in the competition.

13. Disclaimer of Liability: Neither the Swan Valley Equestrian Park, nor Equestrian WA, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, grooms, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever. ALL riders MUST have signed a Swan Valley Equestrian Park disclaimer form prior to participation. This is a condition of insurance.

14. Dogs are not permitted at the Swan Valley Equestrian Park

15. Country competitors located 100km or more from the Event Venue will be able to reserve day yards where possible.

16. Helmets: The Swan Valley Equestrian Park insurers have imposed the following requirements: 'Any person on horseback is required to wear a recognized safety standard approved helmet at all times'.

In addition Riders are to understand that their EA members insurance may be rendered void in the event of an accident/injury, wherever it may occur, if found to have not been using an approved helmet. Helmets marked as follows are approved for use: AS/NZS 3838:1998 (Australian and New Zealand Standard); EN 1384 (Current European Standard); ASTN F1163 (Current US Standard).

17. Warm up etiquette: Riding rules for warm up areas as documented in the EWA Handbook and reproduced earlier in this entry pack should be adhered to. Correct protocol in the warm up arena is expected. There is no lungeing in the warm up arena. If you wish to lunge your horse you must do so in the round yard provided.

18. Officials, Staff and Volunteers: These people are essential in the running of our competitions and events. Please treat them with respect. Poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Verbal or physical bullying behaviour will not be accepted and disciplinary action will be taken where appropriate.

19. Duty of care: It is your responsibility to promptly report unsafe and or hazardous situations to the Event Organizer.

20. Stallion Code of Conduct: If this Code is adhered to, the likelihood of an accident involving a loose stallion will be minimized.

It is understood that "accidents" can happen but taking all possible precautions and making all riders aware of the presence of a stallion minimizes the possibility of accidents.
