

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: All riders must have current Pony Club WA membership/insurance. All riders must be able to present confirmation of membership when you pick up your bib numbers on Sunday morning. The Event Secretary and Eventing Committee have the right to refuse any entry if you do not comply, with or without stating a reason.

REMINDER: Medical armbands are compulsory during the XC phase at all Pony Club Eventing Shows, please bring your medical armband up to the Office when collecting your bib number. NO numbers will be handed out until armbands have been cited.

The Baldivis course is through sandy scrubby bush and care must be taken by riders to ensure their horse is sufficiently fit and healthy and you ride to the conditions on the day.

WALKING CROSS COUNTY

The cross country will be open for walking on Saturday 15 June, the exact time is at the Technical Delegates discretion, but our aim is from 2pm. We encourage all riders to walk the course on Saturday or before 8am on the Sunday.

Baldivis PC committee would like to encourage all riders to please note the following in the name of good sportsmanship and safety.

All riders please ensure that you have walked the cross country course 15 minutes before commencement of the cross country phase at 12 noon on Sunday. If you walk the XC course while dressage and show jumping is being ridden, be respectful to those competitors. Riders and their associates if found skylarking or making excessive noise or movement near the arenas will be eliminated. This will be monitored.

PAYMENTS & ENTRY

Entries will be open on K-trials (http://www.ktrials.com.au/ktrials41/wp3EventSelect.aspx). Payment is via K-trials (Pay Pal). If no entry fee is paid your entry will be VOID and deleted.

REFUNDS

Refunds will strictly only be considered upon provision of a medical certificate or vet certificate, where a deduction of a \$20 admin fee applies. Refunds will not be considered for any other reasons.

COMPULSORY HELPERS

Each rider must nominate a helper over the age of 18yrs.

One Horse – One Helper – the same helper cannot be nominated for more than 1 horse or they need to do 2 duties, one on Saturday and one on Sunday!

NO self-help is available.

If a helper does not report or do their duty the rider is eliminated.

OTHER INFORMATION:

- Entries close when classes are full or 7 June at 5pm.
- All riders must be able to produce confirmation of 2019 insurance/membership.
- Any one rider can only enter a maximum of 2 horses.
- No rider under 18 years is to be left on the grounds without a parent/guardian.
- CROSS COUNTRY JUMP JUDGE BRIEFING: 10:30am SHARP
- All riders must wear a body protector for XC Phase and riders are encouraged to wear one for the Show Jump phase.
- No helmet cameras of any description are permitted.
- VET on site: There will be no vet on site during this event. Local Vets at Larkhill will be on call
- Qualified First Aid will be on the grounds on Sunday. It is mandatory for all riders who have a fall to report to the ambulance
- Canteen will be available on Sunday.
- No Dogs allowed at any time on the grounds.
- Gates open 6.30am

COMPETITORS PLEASE ENSURE YOU ARE READY ON TIME FOR EACH PHASE AS EVERY EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO RUN ON TIME.

AWARDS

Ribbons awarded to 6th place in all classes and completion ribbons to those who complete all 3 phases. Presentations are unmounted and will be held in front of the clubhouse at the completion of scoring. **Please note: Riders are to be** *correctly dressed for presentations*.

Eligibility for the series requires riders to complete both series events

We welcome and encourage riders to upgrade during the series, as appropriate, and one set of upgrade points (changing from one grade to a higher grade) can be applied at the end of the series. Upgrade points apply if the upgrade is successful and the combination is not eliminated. If a horse and rider combination are eliminated at the first event, they are no longer in the running for the series but are very welcome to compete at the second event.

If a rider downgrades at the second event, no points will be awarded at the lower height. Series winders will be announced at the second event. Rugs will be awarded to the horse/rider combination in each class scoring the most points over the 2 events. Prizes will be dependent on sponsorship.

GEARCHECK

Pony Club WA gear check rules apply, no exceptions.

OBJECTIONS

Protests are to be lodged with the appeals committee in writing, together with \$50, within 30 minutes of the scores being posted. The decision of the Appeals Committee is final and the \$50 will be returned if the protest is upheld.

PARKING

Parking is limited at Baldivis Equestrian & Pony Club. All vehicles must obey the directions of the parking attendants or their connections will be disqualified from competing. STRICTLY NO PORTABLE YARDS ALLOWED AT THE SIDE OF FLOATS.

A limited number of day yards are available on a first come first served basis for fee through Ktrails.

Horses Age

- A horse may compete in PC45, PC65, PC80, PC95 & PC105 competitions from the beginning of calendar year in which it turns the age of 5 years.
- NOTE: The onus is on the OWNER/RIDER to provide proof of Horses Age.

Riders Age

Rider may compete in Pony Club WA Eventing Classes as follows:

- PC95 Classes: From the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns 12.
- PC80 Classes: From the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns 11.
- PC65 & PC 45 Classes: Rider must be 9 as of the 1 January

Disclaimer of Liability

"Neither the Organising Committee of any event to which these rules apply, nor the Pony Club WA accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, or illness to horses, riders, ground, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

Reservation of Right

- The organiser reserves the right:
- To cancel any class or event
- To divide any class
- To transfer competitors between sections of or a class
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason
- Entry form to have place to record Pony Club WA Open Rider number.
- Stallions & rigs are not permitted at a Pony Club WA event.

Rule 15 Riding Down

- Riding down one level from a higher level for which a horse is qualified, carries no penalty.
- Riding Down two or more levels will incur twenty-one penalties, to be added to the total
 offaults for the three phases.
- This applies to horse/rider combinations that have ridden at a higher level at either PC or EA events.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the Organizing Committee at the time of entrythat he/she is riding down two or more levels.

Example

• If the highest grade offered at an event is PC 1* or PC105 then the riders qualified to ride at higher grades may enter and compete in the highest grade offered. That a PC/EA 1* rider may compete in PC105 if that is the highest grade offered at the event BUT if the highest grade offered is PC95 then the PC/EA 1* Rider will be awarded 21 penalty points. It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the Organizing Committee at the time of entry that he/she is riding down two or more levels.

New Rider

- A horse qualified for a certain level, upon having a new rider, shall be able to reduce any number of levels without penalty, to the highest level for which the new rider is qualified. It shall then be qualified at that level. Pony Club competitors will not be penalized, in any way whatsoever for acquiring and/or riding an EA graded horse in Pony Club Eventing. (Refer Rule 15 for full details)
- One day events are open equally to horses and ponies, provided they and their riders meet all the relevant qualifications.
- Qualifications for competitions will be as a Horse & Rider combination. They may qualify in either EA or Pony Club WA events, unless specifically exempted by Pony Club WA.
- Horse and Rider combinations are graded according to their performances over the previous twelve months.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

NO ALCOHOL IS TO BE CONSUMED ON THE PREMISES & NO SMOKING ON THE GROUNDS

Abuse of Stewards, Officials, Judges, Organisers or horses will not be tolerated and disqualification will apply.
