#### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

A Shetland Pony is defined as a pony registered in the Shetland section of the Australian Pony Stud Book and the current owner/ lessee are a financial member of the APSB Society. A Shetland cannot be clipped or dyed when shown as a representation of its breed. They must be shown in natural coat and full feather. Shetlands must not exceed the maximum height limit of 10.2hh. Height Certificates may be requested.

#### **CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES**

#### Friday 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018

- Ponies eligible to compete must be registered/ recorded in their respective sections of the APSB Society ie. Shetland Pony Stud Book or APSB Part-bred Shetland Pony Register
- Exhibitors must be current members of the APSB Society and the pony owned or leased by them at the time of entry. Ponies MUST be transferred/ registered prior to entry. Exhibits must be shown in the name recorded as either owner or lessee.
- All entries must accompany copies of pony registration, APSB current membership card, PIC Number and disclaimer must be signed
- Proof of registration may be requested and must be shown on demand.
- Entries submitted must use the official entry form. Please ensure that entry forms are correct as incomplete or incorrect entries will not be accepted.
- Late entries will not be accepted.
- Withdrawal after close of entries may only be refunded at the discretion of the SPEGWA Committee, on presentation of a veterinary and/ or doctor's certificate.
- SPEGWA Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or accept conditionally, any
  entry without giving reason for doing so. May cancel any event or class. Alter the
  time in which any class or event is to take place. Alter conditions of entry. Split or
  combine any event or class and/or substitute a judge.
- SPEGWA Committee reserves the right to instruct removal of DANGEROUS,
   OBJECTIONABLE and/or DISEASED EXHIBITS from the ground. No lame or sick animals can be brought to the show.
- Owners, Handlers and Exhibitors are expected to be familiar with the Show Regulations of the APSB Society and SPEGWA and at all times abide by these regulations and rules and conditions. It is the Exhibitors responsibility to ensure eligibility for a class, and if not eligible, the Exhibitor must withdraw.
- We are responsible for cleaning of the grounds. Please ensure you pick up all manure around your car, float or truck where you tie up your pony. We are responsible for cleaning all manure from the grounds.
- Shetland Ponies and APSB Part-bred Shetland Ponies are eligible to compete in Colour Classes, Novelty, Handler, Harness, Ridden and Fancy Dress
- APSB Part-bred Shetland Ponies are not eligible to compete in purebred classes

- Whips are not to exceed 75cm in length not including the tail.
- The age of the pony shall be reckoned from 1<sup>st</sup> August in the year it was born, if born on or after that day. If born before that day it will be reckoned from 1<sup>st</sup> August in the previous year.
- Mares with foals at foot are not eligible to compete in ridden or harness events.
- Please Note all foals must be on leads
- Stallions and Colts 2 years and over must wear suitable headgear. They must not be handled by children under 16 years. All Stallions and Colts must be entire. They are not eligible to compete in Leading Rein, First Ridden or Junior Handler/ Ridden classes with the exception of designated classes as ridden stallion or harness classes.
- Suitable Show Ring Attire must be worn by handlers, riders and helpers when competing in the ring. Pony Club uniform is acceptable attire for juniors. Enclosed footwear must be worn at all times whilst handling exhibits. Protective headgear must be worn at all times for all Juniors (under 18)
- No person shall in any way consult or interfere with, or attempt to interfere with, the
  Judge and/or his/her freedom of choice. Competitors shall not address the Judge
  unless authorised by the Steward in charge of the class or the Judge.

#### THE DECISION OF THE JUDGE IS FINAL

- Exhibitors or Competitors may protest against an award won by an exhibitor or competitor. A protest must be made in writing, giving reasons for the protest and signed and submitted to the Committee no more than 30 minutes after the completion of the judging of the event or competition. Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to SPEGWA if, in the opinion of the committee, the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.
- If an exhibit is awarded a prize and is subsequently disqualified, the prize will not automatically be awarded to the next place getter.
- The age of Riders/ Handlers, where specified are as the date of the show.
- PROGENY PAIR: 2 Exhibits by the same Sire or Dam. Exhibits participating in these
  classes must also be entered in appropriate breed classes and need not be the
  property of the exhibitor.
- LEAD LINE: Lead line exhibits must be 4 years and over. Stallions are not permitted to compete in these classes. Pony must be ridden by child 10 years and under and no younger than 3 years of age. Protective headgear and riding boots must be worn at all times. Handler must be 18 years and over. Pony must be led from a loose rein attached to the back of the cavesson noseband. No spurs or whips are permitted by the rider or handler. Pony must be led at a walk and trot only. Rider may be asked to dismount and mount. The pony may compete in other classes with a 2<sup>nd</sup> rider.
- FIRST RIDDEN: Ridden exhibits must be 4 years and over. Stallions are not permitted to compete in these classes. Protective headgear and riding boots must be worn at all times. Simple snaffle bits only. Not spurs are permitted but whips are allowed and must not exceed 75cm. Ponies will be asked to walk and trot on the circle and canter

- may be asked for individual workout but rider will not be penalised if unable to canter. The Pony may compete in other classes with a 2<sup>nd</sup> rider.
- RIDDEN: Ridden exhibits must be 4 years and over. Stallions are permitted to
  compete in designated classes with competent rider 16 years and over. Protective
  headgear and riding boots must be worn at all times by all riders regardless of age. A
  rider may only ride one pony in a class. No spurs are permitted but whips are
  allowed and must not exceed 75cm.
- FANCY DRESS: All entrants in fancy dress must wear protective headgear and riding boots at all times.
- HARNESS: Harness exhibits must be 4 years and over. All Junior Drivers must wear protective headgear at all times. A Competent Groom must be present at all times and must wear enclosed shoes and be dressed neatly.
   Junior Driver Notes:
  - 6-10 years inclusive must be accompanied by an experienced driving adult as passenger seated alongside and holding a 2<sup>nd</sup> pair of reins attached to the bit
  - 11-15 years inclusive must be accompanied by an experienced driving adult as passenger seated alongside at all times. 2<sup>nd</sup> Pair of reins attached to the bit are optional
  - 16-17 years inclusive may be accompanied by an experienced driving adult at their discretion. Drivers may be allowed to drive stallion at the discretion of the committee
  - Once put to, a competent driver must be in the vehicle at all times
  - Long Reining Competitors must carry a driving whip. Gloves and Hats are optional
  - Harness Drivers must carry a driving whip and driving apron or lap rug be worn. Gloves and Hats are optional

#### **RIBBONS/POINTS/TROPHIES/ SPECIAL AWARDS**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Place/ Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons need not be awarded as per Judges discretion
- GLENWAY PARK PERFORMANCE PONY OF THE DAY MEMORIAL TROPHY— donated by Glenway Park (All Shetland Show Only). Points are allocated First: 3 Points, Second: 2 Points, Third: 1 Point from 1 Breed Class Only and includes all performance classes including Lead Line, Ridden, Long Reining and Harness but excludes Novice, Open, Rider and Driver classes. Please ensure you nominate on the entry form if you would like to be eligible for this award.
- REDFIELD STRAWBERRY SHORT CAKE MEMORIAL TROPHY donated by Redfield Pony Stud (All Shetland Show Only). Points are allocated First: 3 Points, Second: 2 Points, Third 1 Point awarded for same child/pony combination for Handler Class and all other performance classes either Lead Line or Ridden including Junior Driver.

Excludes Novice and Open Classes. *Please ensure you nominate on the entry form if you would like to be eligible for this award.*



## **Shetland Pony Enthusiasts Group Western Australia Guidelines for Ring Etiquette and Conduct of Exhibitors**

- Marshal: Nominated person to organise competitors in preparation for classes
- Competitors are able to approach the Marshal and advise of any withdrawals or delays
- Competitors are able to approach the Marshal to ask classes being judged, classes coming up, approximate times of classes, lunch breaks ect
- Competitors are to enter and exit the ring as instructed by the Marshal. Once a competitor has entered the ring the Steward is responsible.
- Steward: Nominated person to organise competitors presented in the ring for judging. The Steward will advise competitors and instructions given by the Judge.
- The Steward will advise competitors layout of the ring and confirm where competitors are to stand and present their pony for judging. The Steward, after consult with the judge, may advise you of workouts requested by the judge.
- The Steward assists the judge for the duration of the class and will assist with ribbon presentations, pencilling of exhibitors names, pony name and placings.
- The Steward will advise competitors when to exit the class. You <u>MUST</u> exit the class where the Marshal has advised you to do so.
- Please be courteous to place getters and exit the arena in your appropriate ribbon order.
- PLEASE NOTE: The Judge has the right to speak to competitors. They may ask you pony
  details including pony age, which you are required to answer the Judge's questions. At no
  times are you allowed to question the Judge or interfere with their freedom of choice. You
  are not permitted to speak to the Judge under any circumstances other than to respond to
  their questions, repeat given workouts and to thank the Judge.
- Once a class has commenced no exhibit may leave the ring unless instructed be the Steward.
- There is to be no change of Handler once a class has commenced without the permission of the Judge.
- Please understand this is a Breed Show and Stallions/ Colts will be attending. Competitors
  must be aware to leave sufficient room between each exhibit especially classes which
  involve junior competitors.
- Please be respectful to other competitors and do not engage in idle chit chat/ conversations.
- Please be courteous and respectful to all competitors.
- Only persons eligible to enter the ring are the Handler (for breed shows), Leading Rein (the led child and handler), the Rider and in case of emergency and safety of the rider a responsible adult may be close by if felt necessary but must seek permission from the Marshal, Steward and Judge, Harness competitors, the driver and groom at all times.
- Please Note: On occasions the Marshal and Steward may be the same person.

#### CONDITION(S) OF ENTRY/COMPETING AT ALL SPEGWA SHOWS

All entries are subject to the following rules. The show committee may & without giving reason-

- A. rejects or cancels any entries at any time.
- B. remove any entry from the show.
- C. combines classes. (Determined by number of entries or age of competitors)
  With fair warning to all competitors.

When entering a show (as the exhibitor) -

- A. must be a financial member of the APSB, copy will be requested.
- B.\* financial member of SPEGWA NEWSLETTER allows cheaper entry fee's only.
- C. must be owner or lessee of the pony as recorded with APSB.
- D. fees are non-refundable without a vet certificate.
- E. must provide copy of current ASBP membership card & pony registration.
- F. fees must be paid with entry.
- G. birth certificate maybe requested.
- H. Disclaimers must be signed for both APSB & SPEGWA.
- I. must be on official entry form.

When entering a show (the pony)

- A. age is reckoned as of 1st August each year.
- B. must be branded by 6 months of age (OR WHEN WEANED) & registered with APSB, If in individual classes i.e. 1 YRS & under.
- C. must be in natural coat & full feather, must not be clipped or dyed.
- D. must provide copy of current ASBP registration of the pony.
- E. height certificate may be requested.
- F. over 10.2h are not be too shown.
- G. be over 6 weeks of age
- J. Chief Steward on the Day has the right to refuse entry to the ring or change the Handler.

#### Points to remember

- A. ponies 12 years & older do not have to compete in breed classes in order to enter in novelty or performance classes.
- B. lame or sick ponies will be refused entry to class. (es)
- C. ponies are not to be subjected to unnecessary, unreasonable or unjustified pain, suffering or injury.
- D. unnecessary or undue cruelty to a pony will result in removal from the show.
- E Only the entered pony can be on the grounds unless written permission is obtained from the show committee.
- F. Protests in writing within 30 minutes to the show committee along with \$50.
- G. Maiden means never won 1st & Novice means not won more than 3 1st's (not eligible for Champion)

#### **Breed classes**

- A. colts 2 years & over must be "bitted".
- B. all stallions "bitted" at all times.
- C. foals must be over 6 weeks of age & with a halter (no bit) & on a lead.
- D. at all times colts & stallions must be handled by a competent person 16 years & over.
- E. Colt/Stallion must be securely restrained at all times. Should a colt/stallion escape at any point, from then on it must be one of the following, Attended to at all times or locked in a stable or neck strap/rope worn.
- F. Mare means 4 years of age, a filly cannot complete in Mare classes or her foal in offspring classes.
- G. in Mare classes Foals on leads can accompany mare on the outside of the mare.
- H. In foal classes, Mare can accompany the foal on the outside of the foal.
- I. In 1 yr. & under (weaned) classes, mare cannot accompany her off spring.
- J. No lactating Mare(s) in ridden or harness classes.
- K. In colt championship, Dam cannot accompany the colt.

#### Lead line

- A. lead line exhibits must be 4 years & over.
- B. Mare or Geldings only, stallions must not be used.
- C. protective headgear ASA standard must be worn by all at all times regardless of age of rider.
- D. the handler must be 18 years & over.
- E. the rider must be 10 years of age & under.
- F. rider to wear riding boots, helmet & neat attire.
- G. pony to be led from a loose rein attached to the back of a cavesson noseband.
- H. No spurs or whips permitted by rider or handler.
- I. led at a walk & trot only (maybe asked to dis/mount leg up if necessary)
- J. The rider is only eligible to complete in lead rein & relevant child handler & fancy dress classes.
- K. The pony may compete in other classes with a 2nd rider

#### Ridden

- A. ridden/driven exhibits must be 4 years & over.
- B. stallions can be ridden by competent persons 16 years & over, in stallion & open classes.
- C. geldings under saddle must be adult registered.
- D. protective headgear ASA standard must be worn by all at all times regardless of age of rider.
- E. Pleasure pony must be ridden in a snaffle, No spurs or whips.
- F. the age of the rider is 16 years & under unless stated otherwise i.e. Open
- G. rider to wear riding boots & neat attire.
- H. to walk & trot on the circle, maybe asked to canter in the individual workout.
- I. 1st ridden, open to riders 5 10 years.
- J. The rider is only eligible to compete in 1st ridden, fancy dress & Handler classes & "Specialty" classes i.e. encouragement classes specified for 1st ridden.
- K. The pony may compete in other classes with a second rider.
- L. Dressage, Handy, Hunter, and Jumping a pony can only compete in 1 class however a rider may compete on a 2nd pony.

- M. a rider may only ride 1 pony in a class.
- N. The rider of a pony cannot be changed to compete in a championship However-
- -a rider may compete on more than 1 pony in separate classes \*
- -a boy should always ride the boy's pony & a girl ride the girl's pony winner.
- -a pony may compete with different riders in rider classes but not the same class.
- -If both riders qualify for the championship, both may compete on the same pony at the discretion of the judge\*.
- \*but permission has to be sought from the judge before the commencement of the class, as to whether they can compete on both ponies in the championship or a substitute rider be obtained.

#### **Stallions**

- A. May compete in ridden stallion classes, harness classes & classes where the pony competes individually i.e. Handy pony, Dressage, hunter, Jumping etc.
- B. Can be used in Handler classes where the Handler is competent & 16 years & over.

#### Harness

- A. harness exhibits must be 4 years & over.
- B. protective headgear ASS standard must be worn by under 18 years at all times.
- C. a competent groom/passenger over 18 years of age must be present at all times.
- D. once "put to' a driver must be in the vehicle at all times.
- E. a driving whip must be carried & an apron or lap rug worn, hat & gloves are recommended.
- F. Junior driver -
- 6-10 years inclusive must be accompanied by an adult (an experienced driving person) as passenger seated alongside & holding a 2nd pair of reins attached to the bit.
- 11- 15 years inclusive must be accompanied by an adult (an experienced driving person) as passenger seated alongside at all times (it is optional for a 2nd pair of reins attached to the bit.)
- 16 17 years inclusive competing with a single pony carry a groom or passenger at their discretion.
- 16 17 years inclusive may drive a pair of ponies but not a larger combination.
- 16-17 years inclusive maybe allowed to drive stallions at the discretion of the organizers. Junior Drivers & passengers must wear approved protective head gear (ASS standards Helmet) & boots.
- G. Where a pony qualified for a championship in separate classes, a decision has to be made who will drive the pony in the championship i.e. wining both Ladies & Gent pony class.
- H. in Driver classes, if a pony is driven by both a gent & lady & wins both classes, both Drivers are eligible to compete for the championship \*
- (It would be expected that the 2nd driver would be out of the vehicle & waiting at the end of the line so changeover can be made without holding up the championship)
- \*but permission has to be sought from the judge before the commencement of the championship.

#### **Guidelines for Competitors Attire**

Ladies - slacks or below knee length skirts, suitable dress, long sleeve shirt/jacket, closed in shoes (No runners)

Hat & gloves optional

Gents - pants, long sleeve shirt/jacket, closed in shoes (no runners) Hat & gloves optional Under 18's –AT ALL TIMES WHEN HANDLING THEIR PONIES MUST HAVE PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR (ASS STANDARD HELMET) & BOOTS,

Pony Club uniform, or jodhpurs, long sleeve shirt, boots, (jackets, ties optional)

Ridden - no whips over 75cms, no spurs

Long reining – driving whip carried, gloves & hat optional

Harness - driving whip carried & apron or lap rug worn, gloves & hat optional

#### Points/ Trophies/Awards

- A. 1st place/Champion/Reserve need not be awarded, as per Judges Discretion.
- B. Hi points of the Year as per APSB points system.Includes APSB Show, RAS, Winter, All Shetland & Katanning Ag Show.
- C. Apollo Pony Stud WA Bred Trophy, need not be judged if the Supreme is WA bred, (otherwise 4

Remaining entries for Supreme to be eligible plus 2nd to the Supreme & judged to decide the winner)

- D. Hi points Harness Pony-as per Hi points of the year (except Novice, Driver & championships classes)
- E. Glenway Park Performance trophy, (All Shetland Show only) points are -
- 3-2-1, results from 1 breed class only, includes all performance classes Lead line, Ridden, Long reining & Harness classes but excludes Novice, Open, Rider & Driver classes.
- F. Redfield Strawberry Short Cake Memorial Trophy Remains the property of Redfield Pony Stud

(All Shetland Show only) points are – 3-2-1, results from same pony & child combination, includes 1 Child handler class & includes all performance classes Lead line or Ridden, & Junior Driver classes but excludes Novice, Open, & breed classes.
