ENTRY FEES

Gates open at 7am, or soon there after - Classes start 8am

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Pre-entry only - Entries will NOT be taken on the day

All necessary forms must be provided with entry form. Incomplete and/or missing forms will deem an entry ineligible to compete – even if you turn up on Show Day. **This is the competitor's responsibility.

Show Rules

All Horses must be registered with AHSA and be entered in their registered owners' name.

All Owners must be current financial members of AHSA to ensure correct insurance cover.

Competitors must wear an EA approved safety helmet in all rings and warm up areas. Youth competitors MUST wear a helmet in all classes.

Our judge is in a wheelchair and will be situated under a marquee to protect her from the sun. The expectations from competitors for workouts will be slightly different this year, to ensure both judge, steward and horses, handlers and riders stay safe. Please ensure you follow the steward's directions at all times:

- In halter classes, the handler will need to direct the horse around the marquee and pose the horse inside a set of poles on the ground, turning the horse when requested by the judge or steward, so the judge may view the horse from all 4 sides. Once the judge or steward indicate, the horse will move off to complete the workout as directed. When returning to the judge the horse must stop inside the set of poles, and the handler salute the judge, before returning to the line up. Led Sporthorse classes may need to be modified slightly on the day to accommodate this.
- In ridden classes, the 'circle' will be in front of the marquee. The 'line up' will be to the right of the marquee (facing the workout area), ensuring the judge's view of horses' workouts are not impeded. Horses will then line up in front of the marquee facing the judge, but leaving room for horses to move forward into the placings line up, the judge will call out placings, and the steward will place the ribbons on the horses. Horses will then leave the ring.

No Prize money

The organizing committee reserves the right to accept or reject any entry or vary the conditions of any event or to cancel any event without assigning a reason.

All complaints and issues will be addressed by the nominated Show Ground Jury.

All protests must be made in writing, presented within 30 minutes of the incident, and be accompanied by \$100 – which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

All competitors under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by an Adult to be eligible to compete.

Riders' age is taken from the day of competition.

Lead line:

- Horses entered in Lead line halter classes may not be shown in their respective breed halter class by the lead line handler for safety reasons.
- Riders competing in Class 31 may not compete in Class 32.
- Horse/Rider lead line combinations may compete in all open classes, but must remain on the lead line. The judge will accommodate them within the class.
- Stallions may not be used in lead line or youth classes.

Random swabbing may take place during the show.

Original Horse AHSA Registration Certificates must be available on the day, as this is required for swabbing.

"Derivative" refers to Registered Horses only. API horses only eligible for Handler, Rider, Show Hunter & BPH, or classes nominated API.

If your horse is tied to a float, the float must be attached to a vehicle. Please ensure horses are provided adequate room, shade and water.

The organiser reserves the right to interpret any and all rules as they see fit.

The Swan View Agricultural Committee, and the organisers of the Arabian Ring do not accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders or spectators or any other person whatsoever.

There is a nominated EMERGENCY PROCEDURE in place – and is attached separately. Please ensure you are familiar with this.

By entering the show, you agree to follow all rules and accept all responsibilities.

ALL competitors must remove their own horses' manure and food scraps including hay and chaff prior to leaving the grounds.

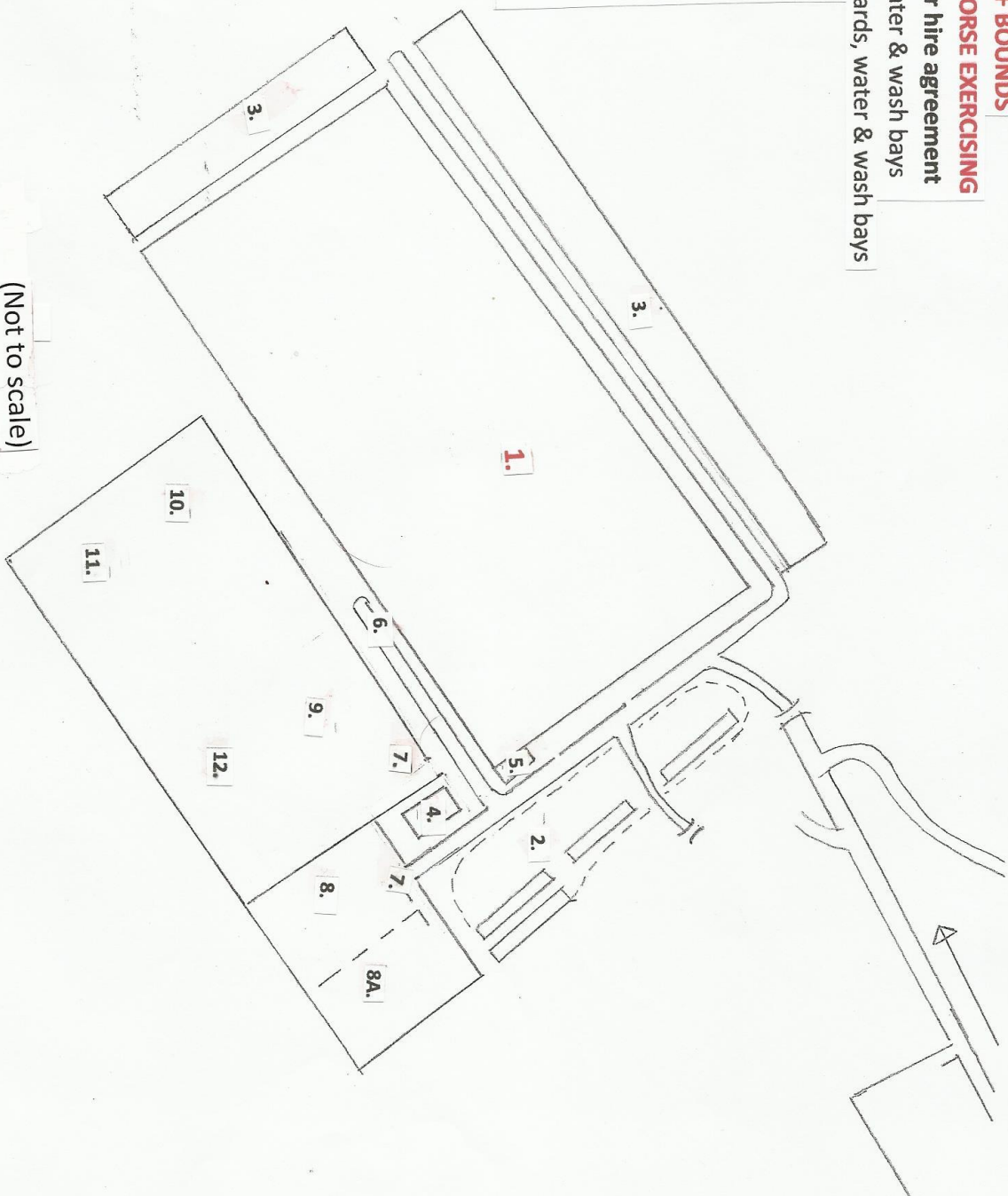

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Please read these instructions carefully.

1. In the event of a loose horse/rider down you will all be expected to come to a halt – ALL RINGS - until the loose horse has been caught.
2. Once the horse has been caught you will be permitted to WALK your horse until the fallen rider has been attended to.
3. Should the rider need medical attention from ambulance officers an ambulance will be called.
4. At the discretion of the judges all rings may recommence competition but may be interrupted again as the ambulance attends.

IN THE CASE OF THE MEDEVAC HELICOPTER BEING REQUIRED

You will be advised by PA system that a medevac is required

1. All competitors will be required to dismount and loosen girths.
2. Connections to competitors if not already on ground will be asked to make their way to the ring/s entry/exit gate in readiness to assist the competitor.
3. Evacuation is to the yards taking the first available yard, will be at the walk in single file.

First, anyone in the warm up areas (8A and 9)

Second, the Encouragement ring (8) and the Arab ring (12)

Third, Official hacks (10) and then Official ponies (11)

We do not want a bottle neck or panic at the gateway.

Bring food/hay/water but please remain at the yard with your horse until this incident is over.

Competition will recommence once the emergency is over. Judges will allow a 15 minute warm-up period before calling classes.

Should this incident have upset you/your horse to the extent that you are unable to participate in any further competition, advice in writing on the day will see entry fees re-funded on a pro-rata basis.
