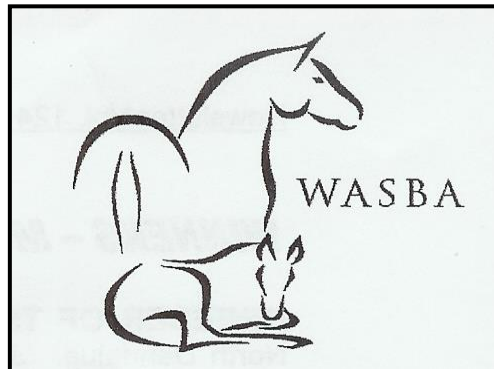

It is a condition of entry that all competitors, whether actually engaged in any event or not, do so at their own risk and will indemnify and save harmless the organizing club, committee members and members from all claims, actions, suits or demands arising out of injury, personal or otherwise caused out of their presence at this show. **Disclaimer Statement forms to be completed and sent back with prepaid entries.**

The organizers of the show have the right to refuse entry to any person, or to demand the immediate departure of anyone considered to be behaving in an unsuitable manner.

The committee reserves the right to alter the program without prior notice.

Approved helmets must be worn at all times, whilst mounted.

Competitors are not permitted to enter the ring once judging has commenced.

IT IS UP TO EACH EXHIBITOR TO ONLY TAKE HORSES THAT ARE IN GOOD HEALTH

The SPPHAWA State Championships is the ultimate show on our yearly showing calendar, with an accredited Eastern States judge engaged. It is sometimes an overwhelming experience for even the seasoned competitors, let alone first timers or those with little experience. Please take the time to read the pointers and guidelines below and do not hesitate to contact a committee member for any further clarifications.

Best Presented Classes:

It is mandatory that in any Presentation class that a Hat, Jacket, Gloves and Whip should accompany the handler. It is a preference of each individual of the outfit worn (Pant or Skirt suit) but more important it must be suitable for handling and running out a horse. No see through fabric and in the case of skirts not too tight or short. Likewise, shoes should be acceptable for handling and running horses out and the top part of foot must be covered (**no joggers/ballet flats**). Hair should be secured in a neat manner. Hats should be not too big as to hinder view and securely fitted to prevent not falling off. The overall picture should be practical and pleasing to the eye and colors suitably matched to that of the horse you are handling.

Presentation Of Horse:

Your horse should be presented with a clean and gleaming coat, tail and mane. White markings should be ultra clean and it is optional if whitening chalk or paste is applied to these areas. **It is forbidden to change or add markings including coat color other than that of the horse's registrations. (IE: a bay, brown, chestnut etc cannot be dyed another color. Color enhancing shampoos are allowed and are easily attainable from most outlets.)**

Colts/Stallions may be left with a flowing mane and tail. Race Conditioned and Junior horses likewise are not required to be plaited. Mares and geldings must have plaited/hog manes with tails plaited, shaved or pulled. Tails should be squared off evenly at an appropriated length to suit the horse. False tails are permitted and should be securely fitted.

Feet should be well cared for, trimmed with shoeing optional. The hooves must be painted with either clear or black hoof paints.

Ears can be clipped out or at the very least neatened, Whiskers likewise should be removed. Various types of makeup can be applied to the eyes and muzzles for enhancement. Bridles with lead or reins must be clean and correctly fitted (**no halters are permitted**). Stallions must be bitted and handler must carry a whip at all times. **No junior is permitted to ride, handle or be responsible for the care of any entire horse.**

Whips are not to be used in handler classes.

SWABBING WILL TAKE PLACE – PLEASE ENSURE YOU HAVE YOUR REGISTRATION CARD (IF SPPHAWA REGISTERED) OR A PRINTOUT OF YOUR HORSES DETAILS FROM THE HRA SITE. NO CHAMPION EXHIBIT CAN LEAVE UNTIL THE SWAB DRAW HAS BEEN COMPLETED

Notes for entering Classes:

Best Presented Classes – all winners of Best Presented classes are eligible to contest the Champion Best Presented Exhibit at the end of led judging. Any second place getter is eligible to contest for Reserve if the winner of your class wins Champion.

Purebred Led Classes – you can only compete in one section. **Junior, Race Conditioned or Senior Gender**

Race Conditioned – this section is for horses that have raced within the last 4 weeks. You must state the date the horse raced and this will be checked for verification. **You cannot enter any other Led Section – Junior, Stallion, Mare or Gelding**

Track To Hack – these classes are for horses who have **raced or trialed** in their lifetime. Proof will be required with entry. A race history can be downloaded from the HRA Website – select Racing / Horse Search. You can search by racing name or brand

WA Bred – these classes are for horses that were bred in Western Australia. If you are unsure this can also be viewed on the HRA Website.

Harness Classes: (Rules according to Carriage Driving Society for Standardbreds)

Horses must be presented in a race sulky only. The gear required is bridle fitted with standard block blinkers or Carriage driving blinkers, crupper, racing saddle (tie down or quick hitch acceptable) driving reins, breast plate/buxton. Dress code is the same as Led classes **with the exception of skirts and definitely no racing colors or helmets. A Gear Steward will inspect each horse as it is presented to marshalling area.** If a handler is required they too must be dressed suitably. Junior drivers must wear an approved helmet and be accompanied by a handler.

Ridden Presentation of Horse & Rider:

Horse presentation is that of Led horses with the exception that **all horses** must be plaited. Jacket, stock/tie, vest, breeches, boots, gloves should be clean and color coordinated to match horse. **Helmets must be approved and not expired. Junior riders are not permitted to use long boots in their rider classes. Top Hats are approved for senior riders competing in the Intermediate & Open classes only at this event. If at any stage the Top Hat becomes dislodged the rider must stop immediately, dismount and secure it before mounting again. The judge will deem you to recommence your workout or start again.**

A well fitted saddle should be used along with a numnah or saddle blanket both to be in good and clean order. Number holders may be used.

Intermediate Ridden Horses:

For horses that are further advanced than Elementary Walk/Trot but not quite ready for Open Hack. These horses should show a degree of softness throughout the gaits and be capable of executing canter on either rein. Only SPPHAWA Intermediate classed horses or non-members confident their horse can demonstrate the requirements of this class and grade will be accepted. **Double bridles are not permitted in this grade with a snaffle taking preference.** Walk/Trot graded horses will not be eligible to drop back to that grade if they choose to compete in these classes. A judge has the right to ask an exhibit to leave the ring if deemed to be working in an unacceptable manner.

Open Ridden Horses:

Only for horses that are either assessed with SPPHAWA as Open or others who are not members and deem that their horse has an acceptable level of training to walk, trot and canter in a rounded frame on a circle and also in an individual workout. Your horse must also demonstrate clean transitions in all of its work and obedience to the rider.

SHOW HORSE CONDITIONS

Definition:

A Show Horse is a quality, comfortable, well-mannered and educated riding horse, being sound of wind and limb.

The horse should be excellently presented and give the appearance of being a pleasure to handle, watch and ride.

Show Horses are judged on conformation and soundness and also for manners, paces and education. It should be noted that first and foremost a show horse is a Quality animal.

Conformation & Movement:

The horse should work with a nicely rounded back, naturally elevated in front and head flexed at the poll. The contact should be light and even. Holding a horse in a shape with the use of brute strength or artificial gadgets is not truly getting a horse to accept and come happily on to the bit.

A show horse must give the impression of covering the ground easily and fluently. The horse must be well balanced work without any obvious effort by the rider or any untoward resistance from the horse. The whole picture should be pleasing to the eye. The horse should go forward with controlled and free movement, the correct bend and an even rhythm in all paces at a tempo chosen by his rider.

Manners:

A show horse should be well mannered and obedient but never mechanical. Exuberance may be forgiven but not bad manners, biting, rearing or bolting. A show horse must show soft, regular, active strides which cover the ground, going forward with rhythm and impulsion. All paces should be clearly defined.

SHOW HUNTER CONDITIONS

Definition:

A Show Hunter should possess more substance than the modern ridden Show Horse but it must be emphasized they should be quality animals. A quality Show Hunter must create the impression that it is capable of hunting over a variety of terrain – this militates against any weakness in conformation which would prevent this, and he must do it comfortably and safely for his rider. The Show Hunter in competition is not required to jump.

Conformation & Movement:

The Show Hunter should have short, well defined cannons with sufficient forearm, and second thigh. He must cover the ground in all paces with a well-balanced gallop, moving from the shoulder, and with the hind legs well under. A certain amount of knee action is permitted, while a flat, stilted action is unacceptable.

Manners:

Manners are extremely important and small misdemeanours, which may be overlooked in a Show Horse, should be penalized in the Show Hunter.

Presentation & Saddlery:

Saddle should be of good quality with a dressage type most desirable. General purpose saddles are acceptable and girths should be dark colours. A discreet saddle cloth is acceptable. Bridle should be the same colour as the saddle with a plain browband and noseband, double or snaffle bridles are acceptable.

Dress:

The dress code for the Show Hunter classes is generally far more conservative and understated than Show Horse.

Jackets & Waistcoats: double or single vent, straight cut which fits with optional vest in toning colour. Shirts & Ties: a shirt with a proper collar in a tone which matches the jacket should be worn together with a plain or discreetly patterned matching tie. Boots & Gloves: riders boots should be leather and either brown or black. Gloves should match the colour of boots. Whips/Canes/Spurs: all are permitted.

Judging:

The Hunter should possess: correct conformation for riding and endurance, substance without coarseness, quality without fineness, straightness and freedom of action at all paces, boldness and natural balance and a steady temperament.
