

#### **Competition Details:**

This unofficial competition has two class categories in the hope we are able to encourage not only the seasonal competitors/more competitive riders but also those who may be new to competing and would like the support of a friend or just a fun weekend with a fellow horsey mate!

The competition consists of a dressage phase held on the Saturday and a showjumping phase held on the Sunday.

To keep things encouraging, we will be running classes by dressage level and any height of showjumping may be chosen. For example, those competing Preliminary dressage will be competing against all other riders (pairs and individuals will be in separate classes) riding preliminary dressage regardless of the showjumping height round on the Sunday; Prelim & 45cm will compete against Prelim & 90cm. This allows any combination of pairs to enter and doesn't restrict who you can compete with! In saying that, we do ask that you be fair when entering your classes and compete at the level you are riding at.

Riders over the age of 18 must be a member of EWA or purchase day insurance with their entry. Riders under the age of 18 must be a member of PCAWA.

Helper Duties will be given unless the helper duty exemption fee is paid (see entry fees). Preferences for jobs/availability will be considered if sent through with your entry so please fill out the section included in the entry form. Changes will not be made to helper duties once advertised. Jobs may consist of pencilling, test running, pole pick up, pack up (available on both Saturday & Sunday), set up (available on either Thursday/Friday and Saturday), float marshalling etc.

#### Pair Classes:

To be eligible for a pair class, you must consist of 2 riders. Both phases can either be completed on the same horse or different horses (i.e. 2 riders each with their own horse or 2 riders that share a horse). The pair classes are designed for those who may like the support of a friend at a competition, would just like a fun weekend with a friend or those of us who are more comfortable with a particular discipline.

Pairs may compete in up to 2 classes. If you are competing in 2 classes, the dressage phase must be of consecutive levels to be eligible for prizes, showjumping rounds may be of the same or consecutive levels however only the first showjumping round score will be used for both classes if riding at the same height so as to not create an unfair advantage of already seeing the course. Rider is able to ride a second round at the same height, it will just be HC. See below for possible entry combinations as a guide. #### Individual Classes:

Individual classes must be completed by the same rider on the same horse. This means the same combination must complete both the dressage test and showjumping round. There will be

a poles/30cm height available for individuals only. If you are competing in the poles/30cm you must do a prep test.

Individual classes are being held for those who may be a little more competitive or would just like to have a go at both dressage and showjumping.

Individual classes are run by the dressage level like the pairs classes to keep it inviting for everyone to have a go. For that reason, we do ask that you be fair when entering your classes and compete at the level you are riding at.

You may compete in up to 2 classes. If you are competing in 2 classes, the dressage phase must be of consecutive levels to be eligible for prizes, showjumping rounds may be of the same or consecutive levels however only the first showjumping round score will be used for both classes if riding at the same height so as to not create an unfair advantage of already seeing the course. Rider is able to ride a second round at the same height, it will just be HC. See below for possible entry combinations as a guide. #### **Dressage Phase**

Dressage will be held on Saturday the 22<sup>nd</sup> May and will start at 7:30-8:30am (subject to entry numbers). Classes are run by dressage level, so you may combined any height of showjumping with your dressage test.

Dressage tests available for both individual and pairs classes are;

- Prep E
- Prelim 1B
- Novice 2B
- Elementary 3B

A draw will be completed for dressage tests and uploaded to Cavaletti and Facebook.

#### **Showjumping Phase**

Showjumping will be held on Sunday the 23<sup>rd</sup> May and will start at 7:30-8:30am (subject to entry numbers). Classes are run by dressage level, so you may combine any height of showjumping with your chosen dressage test above.

Showjumping heights available for both individual and pair classes are;

- 45cm run as Optimum time with altered penalties (see note below)
- 60cm run as table A with altered penalties (see note below)
- 70cm run as table A with altered penalties (see note below)
- 80cm run as table A with altered penalties (see note below)
- 90cm run as table A with altered penalties (see note below)
- 100cm run as table A with altered penalties (see note below)

A draw will be completed for showjumping rounds and uploaded to Cavaletti and Facebook.

#### Prizes for each class; ribbons will be awarded to 6th place.

### **Entry Fees:**

Pairs & Individual Class Entry Fees \$50.00 first entry (per pair class or individual rider class) \$30.00 second class

Ground Fee \$5.00 (for Non-BHARC members, 1 ground fee per entry)
Day Insurance \$10.00 (For Non-BHARC & Non-EA members)
Helper Duty Exemption Fee \$25.00
Raffle Tickets 1 for \$5.00 or 3 for \$10.00

#### Conditions of Entry

- 1. Officials and volunteers; These people are essential in the running of our competition, you must treat them all with respect. Verbal or physical abuse and poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated and will result in the termination of your entry as well as further action if necessary.
- 2. All riders must be gear checked before competing in either phase. EA gear rules apply i.e. no boots, wraps, martingales etc. in dressage phase, whips are allowed in dressage.
- 3. The draw will be emailed out to all competitors, please ensure you have supplied a valid email address on your entry form. Draw will also be uploaded to Cavaletti and Facebook event pages
- 4. Riding Attire: Any colour riding attire is accepted (did I hear someone say team uniform?!) however, white jodphurs are preferred for both phases in line with our encouraging nature we understand not all rider's own competition attire, just please present neat and tidy and ALWAYS check other event rules when competing elsewhere. (SHIRT MUST; cover upper arms, no sleeveless shirts to be worn), approved riding boots and approved helmet are compulsory. Plaiting is not required but you're more than welcome to. ARCA uniforms are also welcome.
- 5. Riders are allowed to compete more than 1 horse if they wish. Placement in the draw will be considered if they are competing at the same height but will depend on entries.
- 6. Raffle will be run on the day, tickets available for purchase with entry (see entry fees on entry form) or on the day.
- 7. Canteen will be available on the day with snacks, lunch options & hot and cold drinks.
- 8. Yards are available for use on a first in first served basis, we do have very limited yards though. Please ensure if you use a yard you leave it clean, otherwise yards will not be available for free in the future. Please clean up your horses hay and manure from the yards and carpark, and place in our manure pile.

#### Note:

Jumping Penalties:

First Refusal	20 penalties
Second Refusal	40 penalties
Third Refusal	Elimination
Lowering the Height of an Obstacle (rail knocked)	10 penalties
Fall of rider	Elimination

If a pair would like to do a second entry but swap phases for the second entry, any combination of dressage level and showjumping height is acceptable.
