The Dryandra Regional Equestrian Park is 190 km south east of Perth off the Great Southern Highway and signposted at Cuballing. The cross country course is through gently undulating woodland.

This event is run under Pony Club WA Eventing Rules. Making an entry for this event constitutes implicit acceptance of these rules. This event is covered by Pony Club WA Insurance. Riders entered in Pony Club classes must be current financial members of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club WA and compete in full Pony Club uniform. Pony Club events have a limit of two horses per rider per class.

ENTRIES: at www.ktrials.com.au. Age is at 1st January 2021.

PAYMENT: is on line with PayPal. NB: Telephone entries not accepted. Unpaid entries at closing will not be placed in the draw. Draw, start times and results on Ktrials. Starting times and helper duties will be available on Ktrials approximately four days before the event.

HELPERS: Each rider must nominate a helper over 16 years of age. Riders must include helper's mobile number. A helper with 2 riders may get two helper duties or extended duties. Limited self-help available only on consultation with the event secretary & must include a \$50.00 refundable bond. Self-help is not available to riders of more than one horse. Entries with helper will be given preference. No help for a fee is not an option. **If your allocated helper does not turn up to your duty, you will face immediate elimination.**

WITHDRAWALS: Withdrawals prior to the event closing on Ktrials will receive a full refund less a 10% administration fee. Refunds after event entry has closed will be given at the discretion of the organising committee but only if a vet or doctor's certificate is supplied.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitutions are permitted accompanied by a Veterinary Certificate. Mounts may be substituted before the commencement of the event upon presentation of a Veterinary Certificate. If such a substitution is made, the replacement mount must be eligible within the terms of the Pony Club WA Rules. No substitution of rider is permitted under any circumstances.

QUALIFICATION OF HORSE AND RIDER COMBINATIONS: Clubs must ensure that the horse & rider combination are competent for the level at which they have been nominated. Upgrading a horse/rider combination that has been deemed competent at a specific level by a club **will require 2 qualifying completions** at that level before being allowed to upgrade to the next level.

MEDICAL POLICY: All active participants (riders, competitors, officials etc.) at PCWA events are strongly advised to carry on them or have with an accompanying adult, up to date information regarding current or previous medical conditions which could require treatment in the future (e.g. Epilepsy, Asthma, Diabetes) or affect the emergency treatment of serious accidents (e.g. Allergies, previous head trauma, etc.) **To this end the wearing of a Medical Armband on the upper left arm is compulsory for ALL riders in the Cross Country phase of a One Day Event.**

NUMBERS & BODY PROTECTOR: Bib numbers must be worn at ALL times when a horse is being ridden, exercised or lunged (and by parents and grooms etc when lunging or exercising horses). It is compulsory for all grades to wear a body protector for the cross country phase. For the purpose of easy identification after a rider has been separated from his horse, a horse must also carry its number either on the saddle cloth or on the bridle (all three phases).

No stallions, colts or rigs permitted at this event. All horses/ponies can compete in Pony Club WA ODE's from the beginning of the calendar year in which it turns 5 years. Any horse may only complete one round of cross country i.e. the same horse may not ridden for the ODE and the Tetrathlon.

EXAMINATION AFTER A FALL-MEDICAL FITNESS: If there is any doubt in regards to fitness to compete the Technical Delegate may eliminate the rider at their discretion. A veterinarian or Official Medical Officer as appropriate MUST examine all horses and riders that have a fall during training or competition before they either take part in another test, event or leave the completion site.

PROTESTS: in writing may be made to the ground jury within 30 minutes of the results being posted, accompanied by a fee of \$50.00. If the protest is upheld the fee will be returned.

ACCOMMODATION: Free camping is available at the Dryandra Regional Equestrian Park. Please keep your camp site clean and on leaving please place your rubbish in bins provided. Manure must be put in the manure pits that are placed through-out the grounds. Do not put manure around trees or in the bush area. **No hay, straw or rubbish to be left at camping spots or in the yards. All campers must adhere to Shire of Cuballing fire restrictions.**

YARDS: There are 48 undercover yards available on a first come first serve basis at a cost of \$25 per yard. Yard bookings can be made through K trials and they will not be secured until payment has been received. Please note the yard gates are secured with a single chain. You may need to bring extra rope to secure your yard. Your yard must be left clean and free of manure and hay. Please place all manure and hay in the manure pits provided near the yards.

CANTEEN: A full canteen service will be operating over the weekend. The coffee machine will be operating in the canteen all weekend. Saturday night meals can be booked with your entry, \$15 includes lasagne, chips and salad (meat or vegetarian options) and apple pie and custard.

AWARDS: Rosettes awarded to 6th place. Prizes awarded depending on sponsorship.

RIDERS PLEASE NOTE: Ambulance and veterinary costs incurred at this event are the responsibility of the rider. St Johns Ambulance and a vet will be in attendance for both competitions days. There will not be a farrier at the grounds.

NO DOGS: Dogs are not allowed at Pony Club WA events.
