Hacking Guidelines Attire: neat and tidy, plaiting and jackets are optional, pony club or adult riding club uniform allowed. If competing in jumping and hacking please remove jump boots so Judge can see the conformation of your horse's legs. Jumping saddles, martingales, jumping bits, jumping whips etc all allowed. Western saddles, bridles, bitless bridles, cowboy boots all allowed. Gear must be safe and permitted under the group you are a member of (EA, PC, ARC).

Canter is optional; if you do not wish to canter on the ring please move to the inside of the ring when the judge gives you the option. Canter in workouts is your choice, have a go, or just show off your best trot work. Senior rider may be asked to show some sitting trot. Hack workout may include lengthen trot. Pleasure workout may include tests of your horse's temperament such as riding with reins in one hand or on a long rein.

4. Young Handler (under 18yrs)

Handler class is judging the handler's skills not the horse, so it is ok to leave your saddle on, if you are removing or changing gear this should be done promptly. Looking for good horsemanship, ground work training, control and relationship between horse and handler.

Horse class is looking at your horse's conformation, trainability/ temperament, paces/ predisposition to soundness and performance/ sport horse potential. Dependent on numbers may be divided into Pony and Horse classes.

7. Poles on the ground optimum time (steady trot speed)

A rider not on the lead but not quite independent in a show environment, eg. needing a support person nearby may choose to take part in the led-in program without penalty. However, anyone competing in the led-In program is ineligible to compete in non led-in classes.

Competitors may do a maximum of 2 height classes. All heights subject to sufficient entries. If entering show jumping only you may do 3 classes for \$30.

All classes are subject to sufficient entries being received. The organisers reserve the right to divide, combine, cancel or modify any classes. Please get your entries in on time to allow competitors to be notified in advance of any changes to the advertised program. Early-bird entries close Wednesday 5th October. Late or on the day entries attract an extra \$10 administration fee. A provisional draw will be published on the facebook event page in the days before the show.

Both Rings will be enclosed with bunting, riders just off the lead are welcome to have a support person nearby. This event encourages all riders to have a go and enjoy your day.

In the instance of classes clashing between the two rings it is up to the rider to decide which ring to compete in. Some allowance may be made provided you seek permission from the judge and do not hold up other competitors or either ring.

Any rider that has a fall must be checked by the St Johns Ambulance before remounting. Riding helmet and boots must be worn at all times whilst mounted.

South West Gate to the grounds (near trotting stalls) will be open early on Saturday morning for horse floats. If arriving later you will need to use the main show grounds gate on the North East and drive around to pony club or trotting stalls area. Trotting stalls may be used, all manure into designated bins, please rake hay up and leave area spotless. Yards at pony club grounds may be used. If parking on the dirt at the eastern end of the oval, you may set up float yards.

Camping at the pony club grounds is allowed, please book with the Shire if you need a powered site (08 9045 4006), and contact the pony club if you require a yard overnight (usual PC yard fee is \$10 per night) - Rosie Duncan arduncan@gmail.com Please note there will be fireworks on Saturday night about 7pm, if you have your horse on the grounds at this time, they must not be left unattended.

You must buy your show entry wrist band at the gate on Saturday morning. We hope you make time to look around the rest of the show.

Please provide a helper or be prepared to do self-help. Special prizes for helpers will be awarded!

Full details of the raffle prizes will be released on facebook, tickets may be purchased with your entry or on the day.
