HI POINT REMINDER: To be eligible to receive end of year HI-Points for WAPHA, you must compete in two (2) shows for the 2022-23 season* *subject to COVID-19.*

Class category rulings:

IMPROVER WALK JOG RULES

- Improvers are based on the rider regardless of the horse's education.
- Improvers are Walk/Jog & Walk/Trot classes.
- Improvers can only compete on Gelding & Mares.
- Improvers are a mixture of Youth & Adults.
- Youth under the age of 18 must wear approved safety helmets.
- Improvers competing on regardless of horses age, may ride two handed in a Snaffle or Shank.
- Competitors who have had a break from showing for more than three years cannot return to the Improver category.
- If competitors have previously won a Hi Point within the last three years, they are not eligible to compete in Improver events.
- If competitors do not feel they are ready to progress, they may appeal in writing to the WAQHA Committee for further consideration.

GREEN HORSE:

- A Green Horse is classified as a horse that has not competed in ridden events at a show before.
- Green Horses are Walk/Jog & Walk/Trot classes for all Geldings, Mares & Stallions.
- Green Riders are encouraged to compete in Improver Events.
- Events offered are Hunter Under Saddle, Trail and Western Pleasure.
- A Green Horse is eligible to compete in Green Horse events for one show season only.
- If injury of horse occurs within the season, owners may appeal in writing to the Committee for discussion and decision making.

West Australian Paint Horse Assoc. Show Rules & Regulations

- The total entry fees must be forwarded via Nominate.
- No change of rider/handler is allowed without advising the show office at least one hour prior to the event taking place.
- Permanent numbers will be used for this show, if you do not have a permanent number, please contact the committee.
- In the case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses and humans, neither the WAPHA nor the sponsors or show organisers will be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.
- In the event of a pandemic outbreak, the WAPHA will follow government advice.
- If a cancellation of a WAPHA event is recommended, the WAPHA will offer a show credit to the postponed event to those competitors who had entered.
- A show credit will also be offered to those affected as 'Essential Workers'.
- No horses are to be lunged in the indoor arena except for the designated times that Lungeline competitors are given to practice in the arena.
- PHAA approved shows are governed by the AQHA Rule Book Section 5 (Class, Equipment & Attire). Further Rules and Regulations can be found on the AQHA website.
- On each day of the show, 1 hour prior to the commencement of the show and 1 hour after the cessation of the show there will be no training equipment allowed in the immediate marshalling area and the performance arena. Dress regulations of Cap/Hat, long western style pants, safe enclosed footwear and a shirt with sleeves must be worn, as per AQHA Rulebook.
- Exhibitors shall not approach the judge for any reason prior to completion of the judging unless the exhibitor has finished exhibiting and the request must be made through the Ring Steward. No exhibitor will request information from the judge, or the decisions made by that judge, concerning any exhibit at a show, on the day of the show or within the immediate 7 days following the show.
- Competitors realize that horse related competition has an inherent risk and as such compete at this competition at their own risk. The WAPHA and show organisers will accept no liability for accident, loss, or injury. This applies to all competitors, their connections, horses, and spectators.
- Entries will not be accepted unless the Liability Waiver has been signed by owners and exhibitors of all horses.
- Competitor's/participants at any event run by WAPHA have a responsibility to always ensure the welfare of their horses and to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect, and compassion.
- Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the Affiliate and other competitors.
- Competitors/participants are to always demonstrate good sportsmanship, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated.
- No alcohol is allowed in, or can be consumed in the marshalling areas, working arenas or show pen/contest areas.
- Every horse entered for competition shall be under the control of the Show Manager or such person/s he appoints to act on his behalf.
- Only contestants in the specific classes and Show Officials will be allowed in the competition arena or marshalling area during the judging.
- The Show Manager or such person he appoints shall have discretion to eject any exhibitor from the said area for inhumane treatment and/ or training of any horse or the failure to observe the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the Rules and Regulations of the HSAA/PHAA any reasonable request. Your co-operation is expected.
- Show management may exclude horses from competition should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the horse into the competition arena.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present themselves at the competition arena gate when called. Failure to report on the final call will result in disqualification from the class. If a horse is excluded from

entry, all entry fees and charges for the class are forfeited without Liability to the show organisers/committee.

- Show management reserves the right to change the order of classes before or during the show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of any changes, which will be posted at the Show Secretary's office and announced. Every endeavour will be made to give one hour's notice of any changes to the running order of events; however, every endeavour will be made to avoid changes.
- Any exhibitor or rider who refuses to obey the request of the Judge, Show Manager or any show official will be automatically disqualified from further competition at the show and forfeits all previous winnings together with all entry fees and other charges. At the discretion of the Show Manager or show committee, the offending individual and his/her entire exhibit may be removed from the grounds.
- All horses must be serviceably sound. In case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge and/or Show Management, may, if he/she so desires, have the animal examined by the Show Veterinarian at the owner's cost and his decision shall be final.
- Riders and handlers must always be correctly attired including western hat/helmet and riding boots. Any person not correctly attired will not be allowed into the Marshalling arenas.
- The disputes committee shall consist of the Show Manager, one Show committee member and one competitor.
- Protests must be made in writing to the show secretary and be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. A cash fee of \$50 must accompany any protest.
- Youth ages will be as of 1st August, and all youth competitors must have the written permission of a parent or guardian or legal guardian to compete.
- All youth competing or taking part in an HSAA/PHAA approved event, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to be at that event as a contestant or participant and in the case of a contest, the parent/guardian must also sign the entry form. All youth competing or taking part in an HSAA/PHAA approved event must be in the care of a responsible adult who is in attendance for the duration of that event, whilst the youth attend that event.
- If a horse is vetted out and the horse has been entered in a youth event, then that youth can use a replacement horse if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show.
- Competitors that are unable to compete in an event due to rider/horse health reasons will be offered a show credit only if a dated Doctor/Veterinary inc farrier certificate is submitted prior to the event.
- Amateurs and Youth can nominate a maximum of only two horses that will count towards the 'High Point' Award. This must be nominated on your entry form.
- Please be aware of the Animal Welfare Policy, this will be strictly adhered to.
- Drug testing may be performed at this show.
- Camping and stable booking to be made directly with the venue.

ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

In accordance with PHAA Ltd official Handbook and the rules of the HSAA the following rules must be adhered to:

ANIMAL WELFARE

Every horse registered with the Paint Horse Association Ltd shall, at all times, be treated humanely and with dignity, respect and compassion. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedure or veterinary standards would determine to be cruel, inhumane or abusive.

The Show Manager shall, upon a report or discovery of inhumane treatment, immediately investigate the incident and report to the PHAA Ltd. Show management shall make every effort to obtain the concurrence of any PHAA Ltd, AQHA, EFA or HSAA approved judge on the grounds or PHAA Ltd authorized personnel, if available.

PROHIBITED CONDUCT

When an exhibitor, owner and/or his representative acting on behalf of the exhibitor is guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct and/or his representative acting on behalf of the exhibitor to participate in future approved shows for such a period as judged appropriate. PHAA Ltd can prohibit from participation in any PHAA Ltd approved event all animals registered in such suspended person's name according to PHAA Ltd records during the period of his suspension.

UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT DURING AN APPROVED EVENT OR SHOW, OR ON SHOW GROUNDS BY AN EXHIBITOR, OWNER OR ON BEHALF THEREOF, IS PROHIBITED.

HUMANE TREATMENT

No person shall exhibit any horse which appears dull, lethargic, emaciated, drawn or overly tired.

No person on the show grounds, including but not limited to, barns, stalls, practice area and show arena, may treat a horse in an inhumane manner, which includes, but is not limited to:

- a) Placing an object in a horse's mouth so as to cause undue discomfort or distress.
- b) Tying a horse in a manner as to cause undue discomfort or distress in a stall, trailer or when lunging or riding.
- c) Letting blood from a horse
- d) Use of inhumane training techniques or methods, polling or striking horses legs with objects (i.e. tack poles, jump poles etc.)
- e) Use of inhumane equipment, including but not limited to, saw tooth bits, hock hobbles, tack collars or tack hackamores.
- f) Any item or appliance that restricts movement or circulation of the tail.
- g) Intentional inhumane treatment which results in bleeding

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

The PHAA Ltd Board may take action in regard to any violation of PHAA Ltd or HSAA rules and regulations. The PHAA Ltd Board shall have jurisdiction to invoke sanction, including revocation or denial of membership privileges, revocation of participation privileges in all PHAA Ltd approved events for a definite or indefinite period, denial of privileges of access or presence on show grounds of a PHAA Ltd approved show. The PHAA Ltd Board's sanction may include denial of privilege to advertise in PHAA Ltd's official publication.
