HIGH POINT AWARDS

- **YOUTH** - All youth classes will be calculated for their respective High Point Youth Awards (Youth Walk/Jog 5-10 Years, Novice Youth, Youth 5-18 Years)
- **AMATEUR** - All Amateur classes will be calculated for their respective High Point Amateur Awards (Novice Amateur, Amateur, Select Amateur)
- **HIGH POINT HORSE** – Horses must enter a halter class and performance class/s to be eligible.

For age division High Point Awards. Eg: All points gained in an approved 3 year old class will go towards High Point 3 year old. NB: if there is no specific 3 year old discipline on the program, and the 3 year old competes in a Junior Horse or all age class, then any points gained by the 3 year old will go towards High Point 3 year old if offered.

All members please be aware, if you require an extra handler at any AQHA approved events (your mum, dad, friend etc.) for your horse(s), they must be a member of the WAQHA or AQHA otherwise if they are not members of these organisations, they must complete a temporary day membership form and pay a fee of \$15.00. This includes all arenas, marshalling and stabling areas. This new rule is due to insurance purposes for the AQHA. Temporary Membership Forms are available in this show pack.

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EVENT GUIDELINES

Please refer to the AQHA rule book for rules and regulations. It is the responsibility of each competitor to know the rules for each class and AQHA regulations. The current rule book can be found on the AQHA website – www.aqha.com.au

1. In the event of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses and or humans; the WAQHA, its committee or show management will not be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.
2. In the event of a pandemic outbreak; the WAQHA will follow government advice and or venue regulations as required. If a cancellation of a WAQHA event is recommended by AQHA, Government or venue regulations, the WAQHA will offer a refund (less \$25.00 management fee) for the postponed/cancelled event to those competitors whom have entered and entry fees have been fully received by the WAQHA.
3. With regards to COVID Vaccination, the WAQHA advises that all event attendees must meet the venue requirements as per Government legislations. Please stay updated by visiting the venue's website. The WAQHA will endeavour to provide updates, should this be necessary.
4. In the case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses, neither the WAQHA nor the sponsors or show organisers will be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.
5. **SHOW HELPERS:** All members please be aware, if you require an extra handler(s) at any AQHA approved events (your mum, dad, friend etc.) for your horse(s), they must be a member of the WAQHA or AQHA otherwise if they are not members of these organisations, they must complete a temporary day membership form and pay a fee of \$15.00. This includes all arenas, marshalling and stabling areas. This new rule is due to insurance purposes for the AQHA. Temporary Membership Forms are available in this show pack.
6. The total entry fees must be forwarded to the WAQHA in full prior to entry closing date.
7. Late entries will not be accepted.
8. No change of rider/handler is allowed without advising the show office at least one hour prior to the event taking place.
9. **PRIZEMONEY:** Feature events prize money will be paid out on a jackpot basis unless the sponsor deems a different split, this event prize money will be paid out on the following basis. 1st = 50%, 2nd = 30%, 3rd = 20%.
10. Permanent numbers will be used for this show, if you do not have a permanent number, please contact the committee.
11. No horses are to be lunged in the arena except for the designated times that Lunge line competitors are given to practice in the arena.
12. At all AQHA approved shows, on each day of the show, 1 hour prior to the commencement of the show and 1 hour after the cessation of the show, there will be no training equipment allowed in the immediate marshalling area and the performance arena and dress regulations of Cap/Hat, long western style pants, safe enclosed footwear and a shirt with sleeves must be worn.
13. Exhibitors shall not approach the judge for any reason prior to completion of the judging, unless the exhibitor has finished exhibiting and the request must be made through the Ring Steward. No exhibitor will request information from the judge, or the decisions made by that judge, concerning any exhibit at a show, on the day of the show or within the immediate 7 days following the show.
14. Competitors realize that horse related competition has an inherent risk and as such compete at this competition at their own risk. The WAQHA and show organisers will accept no liability for accident, loss or injury. This applies to all competitors, their connections, horses and spectators. Entries will not be accepted unless the Liability Waiver has been signed by owners and exhibitors of all horses.
15. Competitor's/participants at any event always run by WAQHA have a responsibility to ensure the welfare of their horses and to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect and compassion. Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the Affiliate and other competitors. To uphold the rules and regulations of the WAQHA and the AQHA always.
16. Competitors/participants are always to demonstrate good sportsmanship, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated.
17. No alcohol/drugs are allowed in, or can be consumed in the marshalling areas, working arenas or show pen/contest areas.
18. Every horse entered for competition shall be under the control of the Show Manager or such person/s he appoints to act on his behalf.
19. Only contestants in the specific classes and Show Officials will be allowed in the competition arena or marshalling area during the judging.

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20. The Show Committee (consisting of the Show Manager and 2 WAQHA committee members) shall have discretion to request any exhibitor remove themselves from the said area for inhumane treatment and/or training of any horse or the failure to observe the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the Rules and Regulations of the AQHA or any reasonable request. Your co-operation is expected.
21. An exhibitor or rider who refuses to obey a request of the Judge, Show Manager or any show official may be disqualified from any further competition at the show and forfeits all winnings and entry fees and other charges from the show and may be requested to remove themselves from the show arena. This is at the discretion of the Show Committee.
22. Show management may exclude horses from competition should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the horse into the competition arena. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present themselves at the competition arena gate when called. Failure to report on final call will result in disqualification from the class. If a horse is excluded from entry, all entry fees and charges for the class are forfeited without Liability to the show organisers/committee.
23. Show management reserve the right to change the order of classes before or during the show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of any changes, which will be posted at the Show Secretary's office and announced. Every endeavour will be made to give one hour's notice of any changes to the running order of events; however, every endeavour will be made to avoid changes.
24. All horses must be serviceably sound. In case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge and/or Show Management, May, if he/she so desires have the animal examined by the Show Veterinarian at the owner's cost and his decision shall be final.
25. Riders and handlers must always be correctly attired including western hat/helmet and riding boots. Any person not correctly attired will not be allowed into the Marshalling arenas.
26. Protests must be made in writing to the show secretary and be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. A cash fee of \$50 must accompany any protest.
27. The Show Committee shall consist of the Show Manager and two WAQHA committee members. The Show Committee may request information from any competitor or observer regarding the disputed event. The decision of the Show Committee is final and not open to appeal.
28. Youth ages will be as at 1st August 2019, and all youth competitors must have the written permission of a parent or guardian or legal guardian to compete.
29. All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to be at that event as a contestant or participant and in the case of a contest, the parent/guardian must also sign the entry form. All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event must be in the care of a responsible adult who is in attendance for the duration of that event, whilst the youth attends that event.
30. If a horse is vetted out, and it has been entered for competition in a Youth event, then that youth can use a replacement horse if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show.
31. In an amateur class, if the amateur's horse is vetted out they will be permitted to use a replacement horse for that class if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. The replacement horse must be eligible according to the AQHA amateur rules. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show.
32. WAQHA Policies inclusive of the Animal Welfare Policy should be adhered to at all times, the current Policy document can be found on the WAQHA website. By entering this event, the competitor acknowledges the content of the WAQHA Policy document and agrees to abide by the content outlined in the policy.
33. Should a member, event participant, official, spectator or supporter be subjected to harassment or intimidation OR witness unjust or unreasonable treatment of a person or an animal; a written complaint should be made in the first instance to the WAQHA Event/Show Manager. An incident report form will be made available to report the incident.
34. Drug testing may be performed at this show.
35. Camping and stable booking to be made direct with venue.
36. Non-participation in an event will not warrant a refund of any monies. A show credit equal to the value of the class entry fees may be granted at the committee's discretion if the request is accompanied by a Veterinary Certificate and/or Doctor's Certificate within 7 days from the date of the show.
