EVENT GUIDELINES

Please refer to the AQHA rule book for rules and regulations. It is the responsibility of each competitor to know the rules for each class and regulations.

BEGINNER RIDER *(also classified as Improver)*

- Beginner classes are programmed for newcomers to the industry.
- Beginner classes are Walk / Jog AND Walk / Trot Classes only.
- Based on the rider's experience, regardless of the horse's education.
- Beginners can compete on Geldings and Mares only.
- Beginner classes combine youth and adult participants unless otherwise stated on the program.
- It is encouraged that all ADULT participants wear approved safety helmets.
- Youth (under the age of 18) MUST wear approved safety helmets.
- Beginners may ride two handed in a snaffle bit OR shank bit irrespective of the horses' age.
- If riding two handed, reins must be bridged.
- Events normally offered are Hunter Under Saddle, Trail, Western Pleasure, and Ranch Riding.
- Additional events may be included on a program, such as Hunt Seat Equitation, Western Horsemanship and Reining.
- A person who has previously competed, but had an extended break from showing, and believes they are suitable OR would benefit from entering Beginner classes must apply to PRAC for authority to enter this category.
- If a person believes they are not ready to progress, they may appeal to PRAC for consideration to remain in this category.

OPEN WALK / JOG AND WALK / TROT

- Programmed for all levels of riders.
- Programmed for any horse, irrespective of the horse's education.
- Programmed as a training event opportunity.
- Classes are Walk / Jog AND Walk / Trot Classes only.
- Open Walk / Jog and Walk / Trot classes combine youth and adult participants unless otherwise stated on the program.
- Riders may ride two handed in a snaffle bit OR shank bit irrespective of horses' age.
- If riding two handed, reins must be bridged.
- Events normally offered are Hunter Under Saddle, Trail, Western Pleasure, and Ranch Riding.
- Additional events may be included on a program, such as Hunt Seat Equitation and Western Horsemanship.

ANY HANDED ENCOURAGEMENT

- Programmed for all levels of riders.
- Programmed for any horse, irrespective of the horse's education.
- Can be programmed as a training event opportunity.
- Classes are Walk / Jog / Lope AND Walk / Trot / Canter
- Entrants may ride two handed in a snaffle bit OR shank bit irrespective of the horses' age.
- If riding two handed, reins must be bridged.
- Events normally offered are Hunter Under Saddle, Hunt Seat Equitation, Trail, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Reining and Ranch Riding.

GREEN HORSE

- A green horse is defined as a horse that has very limited exposure in ridden competition.
- Programmed as a training event opportunity.
- Green horse classes are Walk / Jog AND Walk / Trot Classes only.
- Based on the horse's competition experience, regardless of the Rider's education.
- Green Horse classes are available to Geldings, Mares, and Stallions.
- Entrants must conform to Junior and Senior Horse biting rules. Two handed snaffle bit or hackamore on junior horses and one handed on senior horses in a shank bit.
- Events normally offered are Hunter Under Saddle, Trail, Western Pleasure, and Ranch Riding.
- A green horse is eligible to compete in these events for one (1) show season only.
- If competitors believe they are not ready to progress, they may appeal to PRAC for consideration to remain in this category.



**LIABILITY WAIVER FORM
EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN RIGHT TO SUE**

The Participant acknowledges that the activity being undertaken is an activity being undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure which involves a significant degree of physical risk. The WAPHA Inc. acknowledges that they are providing Recreational Service detailed below which means, providing facilities for participation in recreational activity.

It is a condition of participating the Event/Function that the WAPHA Inc. and any person or body directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function are absolved from all liability however arising for injury or damage to myself or my property howsoever caused arising out of participation in the Event/Function whatsoever whether due to any negligent act, breach of duty, default and/or omission on the part of the WAPHA Inc. And any person or body directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function, or otherwise.

1. I understand and acknowledge that all aspects of handling, working with and in the vicinity of and riding horses is a dangerous activity and that horses can act in a sudden and unpredictable manner at any time.
2. I acknowledge that any person participating in the Event/Function is only allowed to do so on the distinct understanding that they do so at their risk.
3. I acknowledge that participating in the Event/Function may involve a real risk of serious injury or even death from various causes. I accept all risks necessarily flowing from participating in the Event/Function.
4. I acknowledge that the WAPHA Inc. relies on the information provided by me and state that all such information is accurate and complete.
5. I acknowledge the difficulties of participating in the Event/Function and warrant that I am physically fit to participate in the Event/Function and that I have not been advised otherwise by a qualified medical practitioner. I acknowledge that I must disclose any pre-existing medical or other condition that may affect the risk that either myself, or any other person will suffer injury, loss or damage.
6. I acknowledge that it is a condition of participating in the Event/Function that I follow the instructions of the WAPHA Inc., and any person directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function at all times. I indemnify and keep indemnified the WAPHA Inc. and any person or body directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function from all claims, demands and proceedings arising out of or connected with a failure by me to comply with rules and/or directions given to me by the WAPHA Inc. and any person or body directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function.
7. I indemnify and keep indemnified the WAPHA Inc. and any person or body directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function against all claims made by any other person for injury or damage howsoever caused arising out of participation in the Event/Function, whether due to any negligent act, breach of duty, default and/or omission on the part of the WAPHA Inc. and any person or body directly or indirectly associated with the Event/Function, or otherwise.

If your application is accepted, your name and address, as provided above, must be recorded in a register of members and be made available to other members, upon request, under section 27 of the *Associations Incorporation Act*.

If the obligations under the *Associations Incorporation Act* are not complied with the Association can be wound up.

OTHER INFORMATION

If your application is accepted, you are entitled to inspect and make a copy of the register of members under section 27 of the *Associations Incorporation Act*.

If your application is accepted, you are entitled to inspect and make a copy of the rules (constitution) of the association under section 28 of the *Associations Incorporation Act*.

If your application for membership is rejected by the Committee: You may give notice of your intention to appeal within 14 days of being advised of the rejection (rule 5(4)). The Association in a general meeting, no later than the next annual general meeting, must confirm or set aside the decision of the Committee rejecting your application, after giving you a reasonable opportunity to be heard or to make written representations to the general meeting (rule 5(5)).

EVENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The total entry fees must be forwarded via Nominate.
- No change of rider/handler is allowed without advising the show office at least one hour prior to the event taking place.
- Permanent numbers will be used for this show, if you do not have a permanent number, please contact the committee.
- In the case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses and humans, neither the WAPHA nor the sponsors or show organizers will be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.
- In the event of a pandemic outbreak, the WAPHA will follow government advice. If a cancellation of a WAPHA event is recommended, the WAPHA will offer a show credit to the postponed event to those competitors who had entered. A show credit will also be offered to those affected as 'Essential Workers'.
- No horses are to be lunged in the indoor arena except for the designated times that Lunge line competitors are given to practice in the arena.
- This event is run under AQHA rules. Those Rules and Regulations can be found on the AQHA website – www.aqha.com.au
- On each day of the show, 1 hour prior to the commencement of the show and 1 hour after the cessation of the show there will be no training equipment allowed in the immediate marshalling area and the performance arena. Dress regulations of Cap/Hat, long western style pants, safe enclosed footwear and a shirt with sleeves must be worn, as per AQHA Rulebook.
- Exhibitors shall not approach the judge for any reason prior to completion of the judging unless the exhibitor has finished exhibiting and the request must be made through the Ring Steward. No exhibitor will request information from the judge, or the decisions made by that judge, concerning any exhibit at a show, on the day of the show or within the immediate 7 days following the show.
- Competitors realize that horse related competition has an inherent risk and as such compete at this competition at their own risk. The WAPHA and show organizers will accept no liability for accident, loss, or injury. This applies to all competitors, their connections, horses, and spectators.
- Entries will not be accepted unless the Liability Waiver has been signed by owners and exhibitors of all horses.
- Competitor's/participants at any event run by WAPHA have a responsibility to always ensure the welfare of their horses and to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect, and compassion.
- Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the Affiliate and other competitors.
- Competitors/participants are to always demonstrate good sportsmanship, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated.
- No alcohol is allowed in, or can be consumed in the marshalling areas, working arenas or show pen/contest areas.
- Every horse entered for competition shall be under the control of the Show Manager or such person/s he appoints to act on his behalf.
- Only contestants in the specific classes and Show Officials will be allowed in the competition arena or marshalling area during the judging.
- The Show Manager or such person he appoints shall have discretion to eject any exhibitor from the said area for inhumane treatment and/ or training of any horse or the failure to observe the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the Rules and Regulations of the AQHA any reasonable request. Your co-operation is expected.

- Show management may exclude horses from competition should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the horse into the competition arena.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present themselves at the competition arena gate when called. Failure to report on the final call will result in disqualification from the class. If a horse is excluded from entry, all entry fees and charges for the class are forfeited without Liability to the show organizers/committee.
- Show management reserves the right to change the order of classes before or during the show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of any changes, which will be posted at the Show Secretary's office and announced. Every endeavor will be made to give one hour's notice of any changes to the running order of events; however, every endeavor will be made to avoid changes.
- Any exhibitor or rider who refuses to obey the request of the Judge, Show Manager or any show official will be automatically disqualified from further competition at the show and forfeits all previous winnings together with all entry fees and other charges. At the discretion of the Show Manager or show committee, the offending individual and his/her entire exhibit may be removed from the grounds.
- All horses must be serviceably sound. In case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge and/or Show Management, may, if he/she so desires, have the animal examined by the Show Veterinarian at the owner's cost and his decision shall be final.
- Riders and handlers must always be correctly attired including western hat/helmet and riding boots. Any person not correctly attired will not be allowed into the Marshalling arenas.
- The disputes committee shall consist of the Show Manager, one Show committee member and one competitor.
- Protests must be made in writing to the show secretary and be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. A cash fee of \$50 must accompany any protest.
- Youth ages will be as of 1st August, and all youth competitors must have the written permission of a parent or guardian or legal guardian to compete.
- All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to be at that event as a contestant or participant and in the case of a contest, the parent/guardian must also sign the entry form. All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event must be in the care of a responsible adult who is in attendance for the duration of that event, whilst the youth attend that event.
- If a horse is vetted out and the horse has been entered in a youth event, then that youth can use a replacement horse if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show.
- Competitors that are unable to compete in an event due to rider/horse health reasons will be offered a show credit only if a dated Doctor/Veterinary inc farrier certificate is submitted prior to the event.
- Amateurs and Youth can nominate a maximum of only two horses that will count towards the 'High Point' Award. This must be nominated on your entry form.
- Please be aware of the Animal Welfare Policy, this will be strictly adhered to.
- Drug testing may be performed at this show.
