By entering the event, it is understood that you understand and accept all the Conditions of Entry below.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Helper Duty

\$50 compulsory helper duty fee. Jobs include Penciller, Gear Checker, Ring Marshall, Set up and Pack up. (Excluding running) We need 88 helpers to run the event.

Helper duty fees will be retained unless the helper duty is completed and refunded through Nominate.

Competitor may be eliminated from competition if the assigned helper duty is not completed. Preferences for helper duties can be expressed on a spreadsheet once the competition closes but allocation will be at the discretion of the committee.

There are, 5 only, opportunities to waive your \$50 and not complete a duty. After the 5 spots are assigned by request, a helper duty will be allocated to all other riders otherwise we will not have sufficient helper to run such a large competition.

Draw

The draw will be emailed to all competitors prior to the event. Organisers will attempt to contact competitors if a change affects them, but final responsibility is on the competitor to check the draw on the day of competition. Whilst every attempt will be made to adhere to the start times in the draw, it is the rider's responsibility to be aware via the Marshall/Gear checker if an arena is running ahead or behind schedule.

It is recommended that competitors report to the Marshall/Gear Checker for inspection 20 minutes prior to competing. Riders who do not complete a gear check will be eliminated.

All riders must have an EWA tagged approved helmet. No exceptions will be allowed. Any EA or FEI sanctioned rider exemptions must be emailed to the organiser at the time of competition entry so that they are included in the judge's folder

Eligibility for Official Competition:

Rider: To be eligible to enter an Official competition the rider must be a financial and competitive member of EWA and supply their bridle number with their entry.

Horses & Ponies: Horses and Ponies must be EWA registered and have a Dressage Performance Card or Pony Dressage Card.

Performance Card: Ponies must hold a current, valid EWA height certificate showing they do not exceed 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes.

A bridle number must be displayed on the horse/pony at all times whilst being ridden or lunged.

A maximum of 2 tests may be ridden per horse/pony combination per day at EA level and 2 tests at FEI level.

Eligibility for Participant Competition:

Rider: To be eligible to enter as a Participant competitor, the rider must be a financial member of EWA. Membership documents must be available on request. No age restrictions apply.

Horses & Ponies: Horses & Ponies do not need to be EWA registered to be eligible to compete in Participant competitions. For this competition the committee will not allow horses and ponies with current dressage cards to compete in participant classes.

A maximum of 2 tests may be ridden per horse/pony combination per day.

Eligibility for Para Equestrian Competition:

Para tests will be included via rider entry. Riders after entering the event may select the appropriate test for their classification.

Rider: To be eligible to enter the Para Equestrian competition the rider must be a financial member of EWA and a classified Para Equestrian Rider. Para Equestrian Riders must provide a copy of their EA/RDA exemption cards on entry to the competition so that they can be put in the judge's folder on the day and carry their EA/RDA Exemption Cards for Compensatory Aids on the day in case requested by the Judge(s) before commencing their test.

Horse: A bridle number must be displayed on the horse/pony at all times whilst ridden or lunged.

Eligibility for Adult Rider Competition:

Rider: To be eligible to enter an Adult Rider competition the rider must be a financial member of an Affiliated Adult Riding Club. An EA member riding an official horse/pony with a current dressage card is not eligible to ride in the club restricted Adult Rider classes. Further if the horse/ pony has been entered in a participant class it is not eligible to also enter in the Adult Rider Classes

Club uniforms MUST BE WORN in all Adult Rider Classes or you will not be permitted to ride.

Day insurance is required for all adult riders who are entering adult riders classes if they are NOT members of EA or Orange Grove Adult Riders Club. Waiver to be printed and handed in at event.

Horses & Ponies: Horses and ponies do not need to be EWA registered to be eligible to compete in Adult Rider competitions.

A maximum of 2 tests may be ridden per horse/pony combination per day.

Championships and Placings.

You must ride two tests of the same level and the highest combined score of the two tests will be awarded a Championship prize. Championship prizes will be presented when finalization of scoring allows.

For ordinary classes rosettes presented 1st, 2nd, 3rd Ribbons 4th--- 6th in all classes.

Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full for withdrawals prior to the closing date for entries.

Entry fees will be refunded after the closing date of entries, and no later than 24 hours before the start of the Competition, at the committee's discretion. To obtain a refund an original (not

a copy or fax) medical or veterinary certificate must be provided to the Event Organiser, within 24 hours of the completion of the event. 50% of the entry fees and the administration fee will be retained by the Event Organisers.

Camping

Camping facilities are available, for booking please contact Ellen Phillips at toellenphillips@gmail.com. Toilets, Showers and Yards are available. Local shops are close by if you need to pick up any last-minute items. There will be a \$10 fee for camping.

Lunging

Lunging will only be allowed in the designated areas, and not in the warm up area. Very back right corner in enclosed yard. Very front left corner near x-country jumps. Bridle number must be displayed on horse/pony while being lunged.

Class Limits.

A limit of 30 riders per class

Abusive behaviour

This competition is run by volunteers. Any abusive, bullying or behaviour deemed inappropriate by the Official Steward and/ or the Committee will result in elimination from the competition and the person(s) will be asked to leave the grounds.
